

EPP Program Overview

- OSD = central purchasing office state contracts for thousands of products / services
- Currently over 4 doz. EPP contracts
- Supports 1 full-time dedicated environmental staff - work with purchasing teams
- State purchases increased from \$5 mil in FY94 to over \$250 mil in FY09
- > Over \$2 million in FY09 cost savings
- Hosts annual vendor conference, conducts workshops, website



What's an EPP?

Environmentally Preferable Products (EPPs) ... products or services that have a lesser or reduced effect on human health and the environment when compared with competing products or services that serve the same purpose.

Recycled Content Less toxic Energy efficient Reduce waste Biodegradable Conserve water More durable

Recent MA Executive Orders

EO 515 – October, 2009

- Establishes an Environmental Purchasing Policy
- Agencies are required to:
 - use EPP specs in all RFRs and contracts, educate staff, increase EPP purchases
 - identify toxics use reduction opportunities
 - use green cleaning products and services per OSD/EPP specs

EO 484 – April, 2007

- Agencies are required to:
 - cut greenhouse gas emissions
 - reduce energy and water use
 - meet targets for using renewable energy sources

EPP Criteria

- Recycled Content
 - EPA CPG Minimum standards for post-consumer
 - OSD's PIC <u>http://www.mass.gov/Eoaf/docs/osd/pic/epp.doc</u>
- Energy Efficiency
 - Energy Star, EPEAT
- Toxics Use Reduction
 - Third party certifications (GS, EL), MassDEP, C2C
- Cutting Waste
 - Require or encourage reuse/return, recycled materials


> Overall Statement of Policy
