- All pesticides are toxic to some degree and pose health risks
- Pesticides and fertilizers can runoff and pollute water supplies
- Pesticides persist on turf, in soil and groundwater, and in your home
- Children & pets are especially vulnerable to these toxins
- Regular pesticide use can kill beneficial microorganisms in the soil that are necessary for a healthy lawn
